GRADUATES REPORT

Lambda Iota Graduate Brother is a Recipient of the 2009 Distinguished Fiji Award

Tim McGinley '63 Recognized for Successful Career and Dedication to Service

Congratulations to **Tim McGinley '63** who was named a recipient of the 2009 Distinguished Fiji Award. The award is given annually to six Phi Gamma Delta graduates across the country. Tim has pledged his continued loyalty to the fraternity and Purdue University alike. He recently retired from his position as chairperson on Purdue's Board of Trustees which he served for 16 years, and held a board position for a total of 20 years.

During Tim's time on the board, the campus experienced many changes and advancements. Overall 70 facility construction projects were completed, the faculty increased in size by over 500 members, and the amount of distinguished faculty more than doubled in nine years. He also headed the search that brought previous Purdue president Martin C. Jischke and current President, France Córdova to Purdue.

Tim graduated from Purdue in 1963 with a degree in chemical engineering and then went on to earn his Masters from Harvard University Graduate School of Business in 1965. Along with being a Phi Gamma Delta brother, Tim was also a member of the Purdue varsity basketball team for three years and was a starter for two. He was the recipient of the 1962 Ward Lambert Award for having the highest grade point average on the basketball team.

After earning both of his degrees, Tim was appointed as a White House Fellow by former President Lyndon B. Johnson. He went on to become a special assistant to the U.S. Secretary of Labor and eventually deputy assistant secretary of labor from 1967-1969. In 1978 Tim founded House Investments, Inc., a successful real estate investment company located in Indianapolis.

Along with his successful career and time

on the Board of Trustees, Tim has been active in other groups like the Purdue Old Masters Program and the Purdue Engineering Graduates Association. He also served on the board of directors for the Indiana Chamber of Commerce.

Besides his recent Distinguished Fiji Award, Tim has been recognized in numerous other ways. In 1967 he was named the Jaycees' Outstanding Young Man of America and in 1995 he received the Big Ten Centennial Athletic Award. In 1999 Tim was a finalist for the Ernst and Young "Entrepreneur of the Year" award and was also the recipient of the Catholic Archdiocese of Indianapolis Career Achievement Award. In addition, Tim received the Sagamore of the Wabash recognition, Indiana's highest honor, three separate times.

Tim and his wife Jane continue to support Purdue financially in their Graduates years having made gifts or pledges amounting in \$2 million to be given as scholarships to students dealing with financial or personal difficulties.

2010 Frank Norris Pig Dinner Speak: Robert E. Baney III (Pennsylvania State 1984), Director of Graduate Development

Bob Baney serves the Fraternity and Educational Foundation as the Director of Graduate Development. In this role Bob is charged with the development of Graduate Chapters, support for chapter's Norris Pig Dinner events, promotion of the Fraternity's communications and fundraising program to assist undergraduate chapters and House Corporations, and support for graduate reunions. He also has other development responsibilities through the Phi Gamma Delta Educational Foundation.

Bob served the Gamma Phi Chapter at Penn State University as Corresponding Secretary and Chapter President. While at Penn State he was an Interfraternity Council officer and four year letterman on the Penn State varsity lacrosse team (defenseman). He earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering in May 1984.

Bob served as the Fraternity's 89th Field Secretary travelling during 1984-85 in the Midwest and Southeast regions of North America. He served in an interim capacity as Director of Programs for six months and then served as Director of Chapter Services from 1986-1994.

From 1994-1998 Bob served as the training specialist for Bank One Corporation (now known as Chase) in their Division of Learning and Leadership Development. In this role Bob was in charge of employee development and learning for over 500 Central Kentucky employees as well as facilitating learning in other Bank One markets across the United States.

In this role Bob is charged with the development of Graduate Chapters, support for chapter's Norris Pig Dinner events, promotion of the Fraternity's communications and fundraising program to assist undergraduate chapters and House Corporations, and support for graduate reunions.

From 1998-1999 Bob served as the Director of the LeaderShape Institute in Champaign, Illinois. The LeaderShape Institute is an integrity based leadership program of college student leaders. Bob's role was to grow the LeaderShape Institute to

more campus based locations. Bob continues to serve as a Lead Facilitator for LeaderShape.

In 1999 Bob returned to the Fraternity staff as the 4th Executive Director of Phi Gamma Delta. He served in this capacity until 2003.

Bob served as the Director of Learning for the Human Motion Institute in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania from 2003-2006. HMI is an orthopedic service line company specializing in working with hospitals around the world to elevate them to best of class operations. In his role with HMI Bob was charged with managing all training and development for the staff of their hospital partners.

In 2003 Bob returned to work with the Phi Gamma Delta Educational Foundation in his current position of Director of Graduate Development.

Bob is married to his wife Jenni (a Delta Gamma) and has twin sons (Camden and Christopher) who are High School seniors. He is an avid triathlete who will be participating in his first Ironman distance (2.4 mile swim, 112 mile bike, 26.2 mile run) triathlon this August (Ironman Louisville-August 29, 2010).

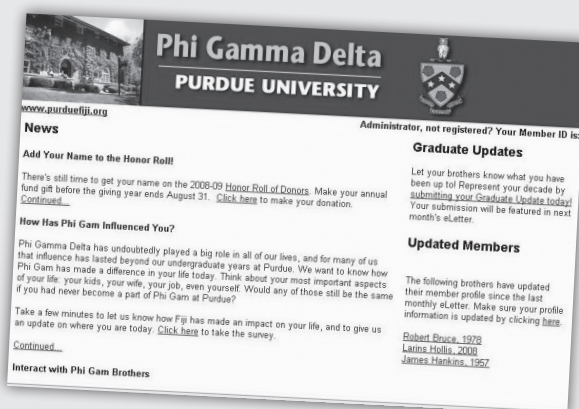

As we approach the end of the 2009-10 giving year on August 31, we need your help to reach last year's record-breaking total of \$13,445.

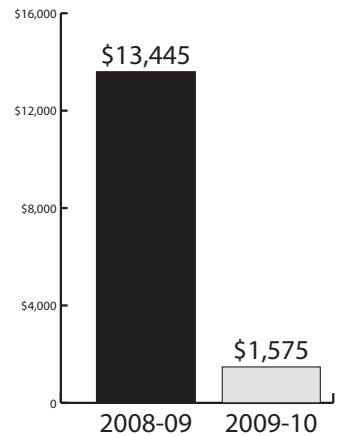
The annual fund supports our efforts to keep you connected with other graduate brothers through publication of *The Boilermaker Fiji* and our web site.

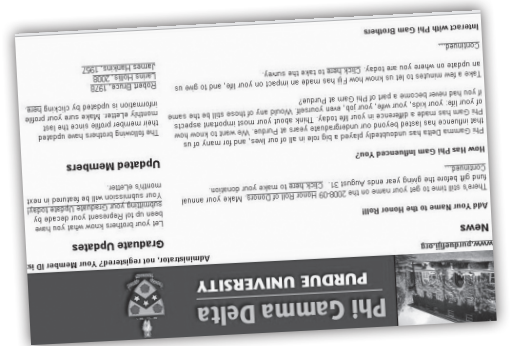
